CONFORMING TIME -- qualifying time standard that corresponds to the ~~course that will be competed in a meet~~ meet competition course.

EX OFFICIO -- a member with full rights, ~~including vote of membership~~ unless otherwise limited by USA Swimming, ~~but~~ ex officio members cannot be counted to establish a quorum.

STILL WATER -- water contained within four walls, or landlocked ~~which~~ and has no perceptible current or movement other than that caused by wind or by other swimmers. (Circulatory systems should be off during competition.)

TIME STANDARD -- the time ~~standard for any event in a meet is the cut-off time for that event~~ a swimmer must have previously achieved in order to compete in that event at any designated competition.

Except as provided in Sections 207.9.13 and 207.9.14, the swimmer may swim for a USA Swimming club or team with the consent of the swimmer's Federation, in which event the swimmer shall remain a member of the swimmer's Federation, under its control and supervision. The swimmer shall register with USA Swimming, and be subject to the Rules and Regulations of USA Swimming (including specifically Article 303 of the Code. ~~One hundred and twenty (120) consecutive days must have elapsed without the swimmer having participated in competition for any other organization within the foreign Federation other than the Federation itself.~~

.2 An athlete who has competed for an organization within a foreign federation must provide official documentation from that federation confirming his/her last day representing that organization in competition. One hundred and twenty (120) consecutive days must elapse after a swimmer represents any organization before he/she can represent a USA Swimming club. If documentation is not provided at the time of registration, the one hundred and twenty (120) days will commence from the date of registration.

USA Swimming, as a member national governing body (NGB) of the United States Olympic Committee (USOC), and as a member Federation of the Federation Internationale de Natation (FINA), participates in the USOC National Anti-Doping Program and the FINA Doping Control Program. Both programs involve in-competition and out-of-competition testing of athletes. In order to implement USA Swimming's participation in USOC's National Anti-Doping Program, the USA Swimming Board of Directors is authorized to adopt rules regarding athletes' retirement and requiring selected athletes to advise USA Swimming of their current location for purposes of drug testing. Each athlete member of USA Swimming is obligated without reservation or condition to submit to all doping control policies and procedures adopted from time to time by USA Swimming, USOC or FINA. Any athlete who violates the doping control rules or policies of USA Swimming, USOC or FINA shall be subject to punitive action.~~

- ~~3~~ The sanctions shall be those adopted by FINA effective at the time of testing. For purposes of illustration, the applicable sanctions as of the adoption of this rule are as follows:
- FINA Rule DC 9.2: Sanctions shall include the following:
- (a) Anabolic androgenic steroids, growth hormones, and chemically or pharmacologically related compounds:
- First Offense: a minimum of four (4) years' suspension; plus a retroactive sanction involving cancellation of all results achieved in competitions within a period of up to six (6) months before the offense shall be imposed.
- Second Offense: lifetime expulsion; plus a retroactive sanction involving cancellation of all results achieved in competitions during the competitors' career shall be imposed. The finding in a competitor's body tissue or fluids of a banned substance listed in this DC 9.2 (a) shall constitute an offense, and the competitor shall be sanctioned in accordance with DC 9.2 (a), regardless of whether the competitor can establish that he or she did not knowingly ingest the banned substance.
- (b) Amphetamine related and other stimulants, diuretics, beta blockers, beta-2 antagonists and related substances:
- First Offense: up to two (2) years' suspension
- Second Offense: a minimum of two (2) years' suspension up to a lifetime expulsion.
- (c) Narcotic analgesics:
- First Offense: up to two (2) years' suspension
- Second Offense: up to lifetime expulsion
- (d) Ephedrine, phenylpropanolamine, caffeine (the level of caffeine must, however, be taken into consideration), cannabinoids (such as marijuana and hashish), and all other banned substances not otherwise set in DC 9.2 (a) through (c)
- First Offense: up to three (3) months' suspension
- Second Offense: three (3) months' to two (2) years' suspension
- Third Offense: two (2) years' suspension to lifetime expulsion.
- (e) Refusal to submit to doping control when requested shall be regarded as an offense with anabolic androgenic steroids, and sanctioned in accordance with DC 9.2(a).
- (f) For all other violations of these Rules related to Doping Control, sanctions may be imposed at the discretion of the Doping Panel.
- FINA Rule DC 9.3: The finding in a competitor's body tissue or fluids of a banned substance, or any of its metabolites, shall shift to the competitor the burden of establishing why he or she should not be sanctioned to the full extent provided for under DC 9.2.
- ~~4~~ The procedures and applicable standards employed with respect to the collection and transport of samples, notification of athletes, athletes' presence at testing, and specimen analysis shall be those set forth in the USOC's

416 303.3. As a member National Governing Body of the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) and as a member
417 Federation of Federation Internationale de Natation Amateur (FINA), USA Swimming is obligated to adhere to the anti-
418 doping rules of the USOC and FINA. In addition, USOC Bylaw Chapter XXIII, Section 2(G) provides that, as a condition
419 of membership in the USOC, each National Governing Body shall comply with the procedures pertaining to drug testing
420 and adjudication of related doping offenses of the independent anti-doping organization designated by the USOC to
421 conduct drug testing. The USOC has designated the United States Anti-Doping Agency ("USADA") as that
422 organization. The current anti-doping rules of the USOC, FINA and USADA are available at the offices of USA
423 Swimming or on line at: www.usantidoping.org and www.fina.org.
424

425 As a condition of membership in USA Swimming, it is the responsibility of each athlete member of USA Swimming to
426 comply with the anti-doping rules of the FINA, USOC and USADA and to submit, without reservation or condition, to in-
427 competition and out-of-competition doping controls conducted by either the FINA or USADA. (Out-of-competition
428 doping controls by USADA may take place at USA Swimming elite-level camps, training sessions at USOC facilities, or no
429 advance notice any time for athletes designated by USA Swimming and USADA for inclusion in USA Swimming's no
430 advance notice testing pool.)
431

432 Pursuant to USOC Bylaw Chapter XXIII, Section 2(G), the management of positive and elevated test results (post October
433 2, 2000) for USA Swimming athletes has become the responsibility of USADA. Any inconsistent provisions elsewhere in
434 USA Swimming rules are hereby superseded. USA Swimming will, without further process, enforce and publish any
435 sanction communicated to USA Swimming by USADA resulting from adjudication of a doping control under the USADA
436 Protocol for Olympic Movement Testing.
437

438 303.4. In determining whether a doping offense has occurred and what sanctions should be imposed, USADA will look to
439 the following rules:
440

441 .1 The definition of 'doping' employed shall be the definition adopted by FINA effective at the time of testing. For
442 purposes of illustration, that definition as of the adoption of this rule is as follows:

444 FINA Rule DC 2.1: Doping offences are:
445

- 446 a) the finding of a prohibited substance (DC 3.1) within a competitor's body tissue or fluids;
- 447 b) the use or taking advantage of a prohibited method (DC 4.1);
- 448 c) admitting having taken advantage of, or having used, a prohibited substance or a prohibited method;
- 449 d) the failure or refusal of the competitor to submit to doping control;
- 450 e) assisting or encouraging others to use a prohibited substance or prohibited method, or admitting having
451 assisted or so encouraged other to do so;
- 452 f) purchasing, trading, trafficking, distributing or handing out any prohibited substance.
453

454 .2 The doping substances and practices, which are banned, shall be the FINA list of banned substances and practices
455 effective at the time of testing.
456

457 .3 The sanctions shall be those adopted by FINA effective at the time of testing. For purposes of illustration, the
458 applicable sanctions as of the adoption of this rule are as follows:
459

460 FINA Rule DC 9.1: The sanctions for doping offences involving prohibited substances shall be:
461

462 FINA Rule DC 9.1.1 For a doping offence involving anabolic agents, diuretics, masking agents, peptide
463 hormones, mimetics and analogues, and chemically or pharmacologically related substances:

464
465 First offence: a minimum of four (4) years' suspension; plus a retroactive sanction involving cancellation of all
466 results achieved in competitions during the period prior to the date the suspension takes effect and extending
467 back to six (6) months before the collection of the positive sample, shall be imposed.

468
469 Second offence: lifetime expulsion; plus a retroactive sanction involving cancellation of all results achieved in
470 competitions during the competitors' career shall be imposed.

471
472 FINA Rule DC 9.1.2 For a doping offence involving stimulants other than those set forth at DC 9.1.4, beta-
473 blockers, beta-2 agonists and related substances:

474
475 First offence: up to two (2) years' suspension.

476
477 Second Offence: a minimum of two (2) years' suspension up to a lifetime expulsion.

478
479 FINA Rule DC 9.1.3 For a doping offence involving narcotics:

480
481 First offence: up to two (2) years' suspension.

482
483 Second offence: up to lifetime expulsion.

484
485 FINA Rule DC 9.1.4 For a doping offence involving ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, phenylpropanolamine, cathine,
486 caffeine, cannabinoids, and all other prohibited substances not otherwise set forth in DC 9.1.1 through DC 9.1.3:

488 First offence: up to three (3) month's suspension.

489
490 Second offence: three (3) months' to two (2) years' suspension.

491
492 Third offence: two (2) years' suspension to lifetime expulsion.

494 FINA Rule DC 2.4 It is a competitor's duty to ensure that no prohibited substance enters or comes to be present in
495 his/her body tissues or fluids. Competitors are responsible for any substance detected in samples given by them.

497 4 The procedures and applicable standards employed with respect to the collection and transport of samples,
498 notification of athletes, athletes' presence at testing, and specimen analysis shall be those employed by USADA for
499 tests conducted by USADA and those set forth in FINA rules for tests conducted by FINA.
