

Wisconsin Swimming LSC Governance and Membership

USA Swimming is the National Governing Body for the sport of swimming. It is responsible for the conduct and administration of swimming in the United States. USA Swimming formulates and implements the rules, policies and procedures, conducts the national championships, distributes safety and sports medicine information and selects athletes to represent the United States in international competition.

USA Swimming is divided into 59 regional governing bodies, the Local Swimming Committees (LSCs). The LSCs are responsible for the governance of competitive swimming within their region. There are over 2,800 clubs and over 300,000 athletes within the LSC network.

The Wisconsin Swimming LSC is comprised of the State of Wisconsin, except for the counties of St. Croix, Dunn and Pierce, which are a part of Minnesota Swimming. LSCs are grouped into Zones for higher level regional competition. Wisconsin Swimming is part of the Central Zone. The LSCs that comprise the Central Zone are Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Midwestern, Minnesota, Missouri Valley, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Ozark, South Dakota, and Wisconsin.

The most recent statistics show 5,785 year-round athletes within Wisconsin swimming, an increase of 434 athletes from 2008. There were 31 swimmers with disabilities. Within the Central Zone, there were 73,771 athletes, and Wisconsin Swimming is the fourth largest LSC. There are currently 70 clubs within Wisconsin Swimming that are registered USA Swimming Clubs. Some of these clubs are also YMCA clubs. Currently, 266 part-time Coaches, and 52 full-time Coaches are affiliated with Wisconsin Swimming. There were over 250 certified Officials.

Wisconsin Swimming is governed by the House of Delegates. The House of Delegates is comprised of the Group Member (Club) Representative, the Group Member Athlete Representative, the Coach Representative, at-Large House Members, and the Board of Directors.

The Board of Directors consists of the following members, elected by the House of Delegates:

- General Chair (CEO)
- Administrative Chair (Sanction chair)
- Treasurer
- Secretary
- Age Group Chair
- Senior Chair
- Registration/Membership Chair
- Finance Chair
- Technical Planning Chair
- Officials' Chair
- Safety Chair

In addition, three members of the Board of Directors are elected by their constituencies:

- Athletes' Representative
- Senior Athletes' Representative
- Coaches' Representative.

The Executive Committee consists of the General Chair, Administrative Chair, Senior Chair, Age Group Chair, Finance Chair, Senior Athlete Representative and Coach Representative.

The House of Delegates and Board of Directors hold their annual meetings the fourth Tuesday of June and their regular meetings are held on the fourth Tuesdays of January, April, and October. Meeting dates may be changed by a majority vote of the House of Delegates. Dates, times location and agendas are posted on the Wisconsin Swimming website, at least two weeks prior to the meeting. All meetings of the House of Delegates, Board of Directors, and Executive Committee are open to the Wisconsin Swimming membership, except when Executive (closed) meetings are required, as per the bylaws.
