TO: WISCONSIN SWIMMING MEMBER CLUBS

MEET DIRECTORS

RE: NEW RULES FROM USA SWIMMING

The following information **MUST** be provided in your meet information before a sanction or an approval can be given.

1) The meet announcements for sanctioned or approved competition must include a statement about the depth of the water at the start and turn ends of the pool. (202.3.6 and 202.4.14).

## INTERPRETATION OF RULE:

This provision was added by the 2009 House of Delegates for both sanctioned and approved meets and it is effective January 1, 2010. Although the rule does not specify any exact language for including the information in the meet invitation, the recommendation of the Rule & Regulations Committee is the following: "The minimum water depth, measured in accordance with Article 103.2.3, is xx feet, xx inches at the start end and xx feet, xx inches at the turn end."

Per an email received on June 9<sup>th</sup>, 2010 from Bruce Stratton, USA Swimming – Under our current rules when a swimmer shows up at a meet unaccompanied by a coach, the Meet Host or Referee are required to insure the swimmer will be supervised by a USA Swimming member coach. However, there is no requirement or procedure for insuring that the unaccompanied swimmer has been properly trained and certified by a USA Swimming member coach to execute a racing start. The following proposed legislation will put the burden of complying with the rule on the swimmer and his parents when that swimmer is unaccompanied by his coach. If passed, this legislation will become effective January 1, 2011; however, it is strongly recommended that LSCs immediately begin requiring the following statement be included in all meet announcements:

"Any swimmer entered in the meet, unaccompanied by a USA Swimming member coach, must be certified by a USA Swimming member coach as being proficient in performing a racing start or must start each race from within the water. It is the responsibility of the swimmer or the swimmer's legal guardian to ensure compliance with this requirement."
